

NLLCA Cheer Parent Code of Ethics

I hereby pledge to provide positive support, care and encouragement for my child participating in NLLCA Cheerleading by following this CODE OF ETHICS.

- I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all cheerleaders, players, coaches and officials at every game, practice or other cheer events.
- I will insist that my child cheers/practices in a safe environment. I will promote the safety of our cheerleaders by ensuring that an I/adult walks my child to and from the practice field and/or games. I understand it is my duties as a parent to drop off/pick up my child from the fields.
- I will promise to ensure that my child is properly equipped and prepared for practices and games, in accordance to our coach's specification for attire for each game or practice.
- I will provide support for coaches and officials working with my child to provide a positive, enjoyable experience for all
- I will demand a drug and alcohol-free sports environment for my child, to agree to assist by refraining from their use at all events.
- I will remember that RLLCA Cheer is for children and not for adults.
- I will do my very best to make RLLCA Cheerleading fun for my child.
- I will treat all cheerleaders, coaches, fans, and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed or ability.
- I will insist my child treat all cheerleaders, coaches, fans, and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed or ability.
- If I have a problem or issue, I will follow the grievance procedure. (See below)
- I will not participate in negative gossip or bad-mouthing of any cheerleader, coach, football player, other fans, or officials.
- I understand that I am responsible for providing (or arranging) transportation for my child to and from games and that my child must be picked up from the coaches' immediately after the game.
- I promise to help my child enjoy the youth sports experience with my personal constraints by assisting with coaching, being a respectful fan, providing transportation or whatever I am capable of doing.
- I understand that if I do not comply with the RLLCA Code of Ethics, my child may be dismissed from the squad.

Grievance Procedure:

Anyone having a grievance should give that grievance in writing to a NLLCA Board Member. Any grievance against a coach/parent should be presented to a board member. Any grievance against a board member should be given to a separate board member. Anyone having a grievance will be allowed to present that grievance before the board where both sides will be allowed to present their case. Decisions by the board will be final. If you are not satisfied with the outcome of the decision, and chose to separate from NLLCA, your child will no longer participate in NLLCA functions (such as games, practices, parties, etc.)
